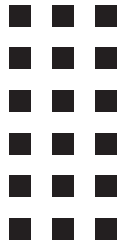


# Practice Dividing by 3 or 4

**Find  $18 \div 3$ .**

You can arrange the squares into rows with 3 squares in each row. Then count the number of rows.



$$\begin{array}{ccccccc}
 18 & \div & 3 & = & 6 & & \\
 \uparrow & & \uparrow & & \uparrow & & \\
 \text{total} & & \text{number of} & & \text{number} & & \\
 \text{number of} & & \text{squares in} & & \text{of rows} & & \\
 \text{squares} & & \text{each row} & & & & 
 \end{array}$$

You can arrange the squares into 3 rows. Then count the number of squares in each row.



$$\begin{array}{ccccccc}
 18 & \div & 3 & = & 6 & & \\
 \uparrow & & \uparrow & & \uparrow & & \\
 \text{total} & & \text{number} & & \text{number} & & \\
 \text{number of} & & \text{of rows} & & \text{of} & & \\
 \text{squares} & & & & \text{squares in} & & \\
 & & & & \text{each row} & & 
 \end{array}$$
