Clinton's Presidency

In 1992, Bill Clinton was elected President. He believed government money should be used to help people. There was not enough money because of the budget deficit from the 1980s. The economy grew and more taxes were collected. Clinton put more money into social programs. By 1998, the United States had a budget surplus. The government had collected more money than it spent.

Clinton helped start peace processes in Northern Ireland and the Middle East. In the former country of Yugoslavia, different groups fought to form separate nations. The United States and other countries sent troops to try to stop the fighting there in the 1990s.

Clinton's second term was hurt by a scandal. He was impeached by the House of Representatives. The Senate found him not guilty.

A Changing Economy

During the 1990s, the United States had the longest period of economic growth in its history. Many people had more income to save, spend, or invest. Changes in computers and the development of high-tech businesses helped the economy grow and be more productive. Computer programs were invented that people could use at home, at school, and at work. The Internet made it possible for people to get information, shop, and communicate quickly and easily.

New technology made the U.S. economy more productive. Jobs changed with the economy. More people did service jobs. Some companies moved factories overseas where they could make products at a lower cost. People with more education did better in the 1990s than people with less education.

A Connected World

Improved communication and transportation made trade between countries less expensive and brought people closer. Nations are now more interdependent. Mexico, Canada, and the United States signed a free-trade agreement in the 1990s.
