In this unit, your child will learn:

- the difference between the past, present, and future
- about American Indians and Pilgrims
- how transportation and communication have changed over time

Here are some ways that you can help your child learn:

Talk About It

Lesson 2: Living in the Past

Settling in a New Place The Pilgrims came from England to find a new life here. Talk with your child about what it would be like to settle in a new place that is very far and very different from home.

Lesson 3: Moving People and Things

How Transportation Changes New inventions in transportation have helped people travel all over the world more quickly. Discuss with your child how transportation has changed since you were a young person.

Lesson 4: Sharing News and Ideas

Communication Inventions Talk with your child about the kinds of communication inventions that your family uses to keep in touch. Discuss how inventions like computers and cell phones have changed how people communicate.

Make It

Communication Chart Together with your child, create a chart that lists all the important phone numbers, cell phone and pager numbers, and email addresses of family members, neighbors, and emergency services. Post the chart in a place where your child can use it to find the information quickly.
