

Tackle Reading Bookmarks



Strategies

Predict

Think about the cover, illustrations and the title of the book. While you are reading, think about what may happen next and why.

Question

Ask yourself questions about important ideas in the story, such as what the characters might do or what you might learn.

Monitor

As you read, ask yourself if what you are reading makes sense. If it doesn't, reread, look at illustrations, or read ahead.

Summarize

Think about the characters, the setting where the story takes place, and the problem the characters face in the story. Tell the important ideas in the beginning, middle, and the end of the story.

Evaluate

Ask yourself questions like: Did you like the story? Why or why not? How did the author make the story come alive? Maybe you can understand it better if you read it again!

Phonics/Decoding

If there is a word that you do not know, look carefully at the letters, sounds, and word parts that you do know. Blend the sounds to read the word.
